As a non-territorial Parish, the Notre Dame des Philippines Catholic Mission technically encompasses all Filipino Catholics residing in Montreal and in the suburban areas, but respects the rights of the people to stay in their respective geographical parishes if they so wish. Their presence at liturgical services is always welcome and financial support is appreciated.

On Sundays, if unable to pre-register, they **must come 30 minutes before the Mass** and register their intention/s with the Ministry of Offerings

FCMM's Policies regarding Mass Intentions

\*Suggested offering - \$15.00 (but more or less is accepted) (make payable to FCMM)
\*The intention can be for a deceased person or a living person. Does not need to be Catholic.

\* The Intention can be for another need of the Church: i.e. world peace, vocations to the priesthood and religious life, conversion of sinners, etc.

\*A specific Mass time and date can be requested,

\*The Mass intention is usually mentioned during the prayers of the faithful, but even if it is not, the Mass if offered for the intention will be posted in the bulletin.

\* Each member of the faithful may offer the Mass for his or her own intention. The merits of the Mass are infinite.

\*Mass Intention Offerings are **not** tax-deductible items. Donations and Special Mass sponsorships **are**.

In imitation of Jesus Christ, we welcome all people to worship and celebrate God's all-inclusive love with us. Whoever you are, wherever you are in your life, we thank you for choosing to be here with us!

#### **REFLECTIONS**



We continue to be inspired and challenged by the teaching of Jesus reproduced in the Sermon on the Mount. Today's theme is LOVE – a love without borders and conditions. Jesus challenges us to love the way God does, for "He makes His sun rise on the bad and the good." That is: he challenges us to love not just those who love us, but every human being, including those who reject and hate us.

This challenge is not for the faint-hearted and the self-centered. It is for people who want to build a better world where violence, aggressiveness, exploitation, and retaliation have no place. It is a world where people are prepared to suffer offense but not to off end or get even; where people are willing to walk the extra mile to please the other.

Many Christians have often forgotten this aspect of Jesus' teaching and have behaved like those who have no God. Let our participation in the Eucharist celebration today be an opportunity to recommit ourselves to love the way Jesus taught and loved.

### The Call to Love Without Borders

The most destructive forces in the world are not nuclear weapons, earthquakes, and other death-sowing disasters. *The most destructive force is hatred*. This dreadful power disfigures and shatters the heart of man and society. Hatred is man's greatest enemy, the anti-life force par excellence. Only one force can oppose and overcome hatred and make up for its deadly effects: *LOVE*.

Love is life. It has the power to renew the heart of man . . . to renew the face of the earth. Love is God's "invention." It is God's very life, for "God is Love" (1 )n 4:8). Man and his world were brought into existence by Love. Love is what



maintains them and guides them to their final "destination" – heaven. Love is the heart of the world; the heart of whatever is beautiful, worthy and uplifting. Love has many faces, many "family names." Depending on the circumstances and the needs of our "neighbor," love becomes appreciation, acceptance, encouragement, self-forgetfulness, offering or accepting a gift, patient waiting or immediate action, a word of correction or quiet listening, a radiant smile or an intent look, timely help, and forgiveness . . . The actions performed may be the most diverse, but one is their root, the fundamental attitude that prompts them all: LOVE.

But in this world of ours, poisoned by sin and crippled by moral weakness, it is not easy to love everybody and at all times. We need a teacher and one who gives us the strength we need to put into practice what we have learned. *Jesus is that teacher*. We need one to show us in practice how to love. God the Father, of

course, is our first and most perfect model, for He created all things out of love and keeps them in existence out of love, as He "makes His sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust." But among all the innumerable "signs" of His love, none can equal the gift of His eternal Son, "for God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (In 3:16). And Jesus, as "the human face of God" or "love made flesh," is not only God's love for us, but also our most perfect human model of how we should love both God and neighbor. For it was out of love for the Father that the man Jesus lived and suffered to the outmost. At the same time, it was out of love for mankind that he spent his whole life and endured such a terrible death in order that all might have life and have it to the full. (See In 10:10.)

Jesus, then, is our divine and human model we have to look up to and imitate. We also need an internal strength to energize us, especially when loving becomes a hard test. Jesus is also the one who infuses in us the strength that we need in order to love even our enemies and executioners, if it should happen, to the very end. Among the many things that matter in life, one tops them all: LOVE. Of all the virtues we can practise, "there are three that last: faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is LOVE" (1 Cor 13:13).

#### **REFLECTIONS**

#### THE FIGHT WITHIN

Today's readings revolve around the "logic of violence" and turn it on its head. "You shall not bear hatred . . . Take no revenge and cherish no grudge," says God through the prophet Moses (Leviticus 19:17, 18). Jesus says, "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew 5:43–44). The struggle to do this begins within our own hearts.

An old tale of the Cherokee people concerns a boy who was angry at a friend who had done him an injustice. His grandfather sat him down, saying, "I too, at times, have felt hatred toward those who have injured me, with no sorrow for what they did. But hate wears you down, and does not hurt your enemy. It is like taking poison and wishing your enemy would die. I have struggled with these feelings many times." He continued, "It is as if there are two wolves inside me. One is good and does no harm. He lives in harmony with all around him, and does not take offense when no offense was intended. He will only fight as the last resort, and in the right way. But the other wolf—ah, he is full of anger. The smallest thing will send him into a fit of temper. He fights everyone, all the time, for no reason. He cannot think because his anger and hate are so great. It is helpless anger, for his anger will change nothing. Sometimes it is hard to live with these two wolves inside me, for both of them try to dominate my spirit." The boy looked intently into his grandfather's eyes and asked, "Which one wins, Grandfather?" The old man smiled and said, "The one I feed."
