On Sundays, if unable to pre-register, they **must come 30 minutes before the Mass** and register their intention/s with the Ministry of Offerings

FCMM's Policies regarding Mass Intentions

*Suggested offering - \$15.00 (but more or less is accepted) (make payable to FCMM)
*The intention can be for a deceased person or a living person. Does not need to be Catholic.

* The Intention can be for another need of the Church: i.e. world peace, vocations to the priesthood and religious life, conversion of sinners, etc.

*A specific Mass time and date can be requested,

*The Mass intention is usually mentioned during the prayers of the faithful, but even if it is not, the Mass if offered for the intention will be posted in the bulletin.

* Each member of the faithful may offer the Mass for his or her own intention. The merits of the Mass are infinite.

*Mass Intention Offerings are **not** tax-deductible items. Donations and Special Mass sponsorships **are**.

REFLECTIONS



Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, we are invited to concentrate on Jesus, the Light of all Nations.

His consecration to the Lord reminds us also of our own consecration to Him on the day of our baptism. Like Jesus, we too, are expected to live in an attitude of constant self-offering in the service of the Kingdom.

Like Jesus, we too are expected to appreciate life and do our best to promote it in all its potentials, and to protect it from all attacks and whatever endangers or harms it.

In this Eucharist, as we celebrate Pro-Life Sunday, let us renew our commitment to love life and to make amends for all the profanations and attacks it constantly suffers.

COMMEMORATION, OFFERTORY AND PROPHECY

The "presentation" of a male firstborn in the Temple was both an expression of gratitude for the sparing of the Jewish firstborns in Egypt, and a profession of faith in God as the source of all life. Strictly speaking, the presentation was a consecration of the child to the Lord. But the possibility of "redeeming" him through an offering, in many cases, made the rite just a little more than a pious formality. Not so in the case of Jesus. His presentation in the Temple was a solemn consecration and a real offertory. It expressed in a ritual manner the deepest reality of the purpose of Jesus' very existence - to be totally consecrated to the service of the Father. His "presentation" in the Temple was an anticipation and a prophecy of his self-offering on Calvary for the salvation of all men. God, who had spared the Israelite firstborns in Egypt, would not spare his own firstborn Son, but would hand him over for us all. (See Rom 8:32 and Jn 3:16.)

For her part, Mary, his mother, was part of that sacrificial offering not only in the Temple, but also on Calvary, as Simeon prophesied: "Suffering, like a sword, will pierce your heart." (Lk 2:35. See also Jn 19:25.)



Ordinary Time: Winter A Sense of the Season

What do the words
Ordinary Time mean?
Dorothy Day said, "The
words 'Ordinary Time'
in our prayer books put
me in a state of
confusion and
irritation. To me, no

time is ordinary." She was right. The Ordinary in Ordinary Time refers to ordinal—counted—time, not to a lack of something to celebrate. The Roman document, General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, says: "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character [Advent, Christmastime, Lent, Triduum and Eastertime], 33 or 34 weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects." (#43)

How do we celebrate "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects"? We gather every Sunday. Sunday is our original feast day. Christians have gathered every Sunday—the day of Christ's resurrection, the first day of the week—ever since there were Christians.

Each year there are two blocks of Ordinary Time, one in the winter between Christmastime and Lent, and the other in summer and fall, from Pentecost through Christ the King. When we gather on Sundays in Ordinary Time, as always, we hear the scriptures proclaimed. We systematically read through the gospels. The first readings from the first testament of the Bible were chosen for their relationship to the gospel passages. The second readings come from the various letters of the second testament of the Bible. The mystery of Christ "in all its aspects" unfolds.

What is the heart of our Sunday celebration? We do our Eucharist; that is, we do our thanksgiving. We praise and thank God for all creation; we pray for the whole world, as we remember Christ's life, death and resurrection. We share the bread and wine, the body and blood. We are sent forth to be the body and blood of Christ in our homes, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, our towns, our cities, our country, our world.

"What happens in our churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week past is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom. This is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living."
