Established on December 10. 1989 by the late Paul Cardinal Gregoire to serve the spiritual and religious needs of the growing Filipino Catholics in the Archdiocese of Montreal.

As a non-territorial Parish, the Notre Dame des Philippines Catholic Mission technically encompasses all Filipino Catholics residing in Montreal and in the suburban areas, but respects the rights of the people to stay in their respective geographical parishes if they so wish. Their presence at liturgical services is always welcome and financial support is appreciated.

On Sundays, if unable to pre-register, they **must come 30 minutes before the Mass** and register their intention/s with the Ministry of Offerings

FCMM's Policies regarding Mass Intentions

*Suggested offering - \$15.00 (minimum amount, but more is accepted) (make payable to FCMM)

*The intention can be for a deceased person or a living person. Does not need to be Catholic.

* The Intention can be for another need of the Church: i.e. world peace, vocations to the priesthood and religious life, conversion of sinners, etc.

*A specific Mass time and date can be requested,

*The Mass intention is usually mentioned during the prayers of the faithful, but even if it is not, the Mass if offered for the intention will be posted in the bulletin.

* Each member of the faithful may offer the Mass for his or her own intention. The merits of the Mass are infinite.

*Mass Intention Offerings are **not** tax-deductible items. Donations and Special Mass sponsorships **are**.

REFLECTION



On this 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus challenges us to "give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." This means that we should integrate into one harmonious reality the good qualities of being honest citizens and devout Catholics. The teaching of the Church on these two aspects of our life offer us a sure guide, but such teaching will become fruitful only to the extent that we put it into practice. Let our participation in the Eucharistic celebration be a renewed commitment on our part to give our very best for the good of the Church and our country.

Today is World Mission Sunday. Let us offer this Mass for all our missionaries and the people among whom they work.



LEARNING TO GET INVOLVED

For centuries Christians have concentrated mostly on "giving to God what belongs to God."

Religious observances were top priority on their agenda, as well as in their examination of conscience. They offered the criterion to decide whether one was

a "practising Catholic" or not. "Give to Caesar what is due to Caesar" was generally understood as paying one's taxes and obeying the laws of the country promulgated by the legitimate authority. **Contributive justice and obedience to the legitimate authority are just two aspects of our civic duties.** Important and hard as these may be, there are also other ways in which we are expected to make our contribution to the building up of a better, more humane, more just society.

The list is long: love of country and its cultural values, respect for the environment, honesty, good example, solidarity, contribution of ideas and even constructive criticism, avoidance of waste, hard work, considering the whole nation as one's "greater family".... These are just some of the ways through which we "give to Caesar what is due to Caesar" – some aspects of what it means to be a "good citizen" today. Even the term "good citizen" must have, for us, a wider meaning now than it had in the past. It must mean to be an active and responsible

member of the family of nations that make up mankind – one that takes to heart the hopes, aspirations, and difficulties of every human being and society. We must learn to leave our ghettoes and acquire a "participative mentality." We must learn to feel responsible for the world in all its aspects because this is our world – the world God has entrusted to our stewardship in order that we make it "the blueprint of the Kingdom." Vatican II and subsequent pronouncements of the Church's Teaching Authority have not only confirmed this "new orientation," but have also spelled it out in greater detail. They have also proclaimed clearly that it is the specific duty of the Catholic laity to get involved – and actually to take the lead – in the building of a better world. This is their mission. It is in accomplishing

such a "mission to the world" that they will be contributing to the coming of God's Kingdom here on earth, and thereby bring about their own sanctification.

One cannot be a good Christian if one does not endeavor to be a good citizen of one's country as well as of all the "family of nations." We must be fully involved. We owe it to ourselves, to society, to the Church. It is only by "giving to Caesar what is due to Caesar" that we begin to give to God what is due to God."



MISSION SUNDAY, a special day of the year when we recall that we are one with mission priests, religious and lay people who, day by

day, year in and out, speak and live their faith in Jesus with the poorest of our human family. This is a time for us to share our prayers and financial sacrifices for the missionary work of the Church. It is also a day to remind us that by our Baptism, our Confirmation and our participation in the Eucharist we accept the Christian responsibility to continue Jesus' mission to the world. We may never be called to serve God in some foreign land, but all are called to work with Christ right where we are. Somehow we have to let this truth sink into the very depths of our hearts: "Jesus is at work in the world and my life is a part of the action." We cannot give what we do not have. We have to grow in Christ through prayer, study, sacraments and association with the believing community in order to have something to share. As great as Saint Paul was as a missionary he had to continually engage in prayer and fasting, Eucharist and community in order to have someone to give away. In his letters we read during liturgy these days he encourages us to do the same—to be filled with Christ in love and then share him with others. No, we may never get to be missionaries afar off but we can be—and must be sent to those other people around us to share the Lord and the work of the Lord. The good of our community and our world demands this of us. "Why did God make you? "To know him; to love him and to serve him in this world and to be happy with him in the next." That is Good News. Rejoice in it and share it as home missioners.


POPE PAUL VI BEATIFIED TODAY!

The cause for the beatification and eventual canonization of Pope Paul VI- who died in 1978 commenced in 1993 and still continues. He has been proclaimed Servant of God and has been declared Venerable.

Today, 19 October, he will be beatified after the recognition of a miracle had been attributed to his intercession. He will be known as 'Blessed' from this point on. The next step would be the recognition of another miracle which would result in canonization.
