Fourth Sunday in Easter



In today's gospel parable, the hired man doesn't have a sufficiently deep or committed relationship to the sheep and so he runs away in danger. The good shepherd, however, the one who owns

the sheep and has much more at stake than the hired hand, is concerned about, cares for, and protects the sheep even to the point of laying down the shepherd's life. The good shepherd is the one who fulfills the obligation of relationship. The shepherd's mission—leading the sheep appropriately—flows from the relationship—the shepherd owns the sheep. Laving down our lives for the sake of others doesn't mean that we will be nailed to a cross. It does mean that we commit ourselves to good deeds such as caring for the sick, forgiving those who wrong us , giving thanks and praise to God, loving others as God has loved us. These good deeds are the very "stuff" of our everyday living. We don't have to go out of our way to be good shepherds. We simply must relate as one filled with new life to those who come our wav.



Today's gospel is Jesus' explanation of His most intimate relationships that never end—believers, Jesus and God the Father, together forever. All of us at the FCMM are believers that Jesus and God His Father are one,

and there are millions more believers outside of our parish.

In the spirit of hospitality let us strive to perfect all relationships. Let us be mindful of the fact that we will be together for a really long time. Greet others as if you're their friend forever, because they most likely will be!

The Easter Season

The Triduum ended on Easter Sunday evening. We then began the seven-week *Easter Season* which lasts through Pentecost Sunday. It is a season full of life. In the northern hemisphere it is springtime. Rivers and streams come alive. Trees sprout new leaves. Flowers

blossom and birds sing. The Church says to us, "This is the perfect time of the year to celebrate life—a life that lasts forever. Enjoy! Let there be a 50-day festival. Let the Paschal Candle, lit from the Easter fire, burn brightly throughout these days. Catch the spirit in the air and let it remind you of the Holy Spirit within you." Two "resolutions" are in order. The first is not to miss out on the Easter season. Easter doesn't end when we go to bed on Easter Sunday night. It lasts 50 days. We need to catch the spirit of this season and let the good news sink in: Death has been conquered! Second, through lent we have been spending more time with the Lord, listening to him speak personally to us through the words of Scripture. We, perhaps, have enjoyed the tradition of daily prayer. We need to keep it going the whole year round.
